On Wednesday 26 May we acknowledged **National Sorry Day**. Mrs Braganza's class hosted the assembly with Emily and Rahela reminding us all of the significance of Sorry Day for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples.

Not very long ago in Australia, it was government policy to remove Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children from their families. From 1910 to 1970, thousands of children were taken away by government authorities. These children are known today as the Stolen Generation. Every year, we remember the past so that we can move forward as a nation.

National Reconciliation Week

Following Sorry Day is National Reconciliation Week. The anniversary dates which mark National Reconciliation Week (NRW) are significant milestones for reconciliation: **27 May – the 1967 Referendum, and 3 June – the High Court Mabo decision**. As a school, through classroom activities and discussion, we ensure that our students, the future generations of Australia, understand Australia's history and move forward to create a nation that is strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

In Australia, we are fortunate to have one of the richest and oldest continuing cultures in the world. That is something that should be recognised and celebrated.

NAPLAN

Students in years 3, 5 and 7 completed the Online NAPLAN assessments in weeks 3 and 4 this term. I was very proud of the effort that all students put in to do their best. While we recognise that NAPLAN is only one part of our formal assessment collection over the year, it does provide us with valuable information about our improvement work at the school. A lethal parasite


Monoculture farming
